ADULT EDUCATION



Strategic Relocation and Accessibility www.epobaby.org

Expectant Parents Organization provides support services and courses for pregnant and postpartum individuals and their families. They request **\$5,000** to relocate to a more accessible site along a public bus route in Lansing, increasing low-income student participation from 18% to at least 25% in 2024. Funds will go towards program administration, securing a new facility, and outreach marketing in their new location. \$1,000 will go directly to a scholarship fund for low-income students.



Emotion Coaching Educational Workshop for Parents www.focusonlovefoundation.org

Focus On Love Foundation coaches children through processing complex emotions, while offering emotion coaching support, education and learning resources to parents and caregivers through the art of photography. A gift of **\$2,600** would fund two educational workshops for parents on the topic of emotion coaching which include support from a professional emotion coaching social worker, workshop materials and supplies. Focus on Love serves residents in Ingham, Eaton, and Clinton County.

ANIMAL WELFARE



Feeding Compassion: Support Farm Animal Welfare mittenmisfits.org

Mitten Misfits Farm Sanctuary provides a forever home to over 80 (and growing!) rescued farm animals. They welcome visitors to meet the residents and learn how animals can thrive with compassion. All donations they receive go towards animal care. A gift of **\$5,000** would be used for grain, hay cubes, hay, prescription medications, and veterinary care for the animals for approximately one month.

Nottingham Nature Nook is the primary wildlife rehabilitation center in the Capital Region that provides food and care for songbirds, mammals, and fawns. Food is a major expense in our operating budget. A gift of \$5,000 will allow us to provide food for wildlife for one month. As the amount of wildlife in our care increases so does the cost of caring for them.

ARTS & CULTURE

Capitol Harp Ensemble offers a rare experience of learning and observing the harp in an accessible, low-cost, friendly environment with quality instruction. A gift of **\$5,000** would support marketing expenses, artist, and administration fees for presentations to 10 community partners. Previous partners include hospitals, schools, libraries, and the Ronald McDonald House.

Gospel Army Black History Group is a youth led living history program. It is comprised of students from the Greater Lansing area who portray Michigan's African American Civil War regiment with the most historical accuracy possible. The group participates in reenactments, parades, presentations, and ceremonies in Michigan. A gift of **\$5,000** would support uniforms (the primary expense), traveling expenses, and authentic equipment.



MICA serves as a catalyst for community transformation through the arts. They create spaces where people can gather and explore creative or artistic ways to make our community better. A donation of **\$5,000** will provide staffing for 10 additional gallery hours/week, 15 more gallery events, participation in 20 more community events, and the coordination of 300 MICA volunteers, reaching approximately 350,000 people throughout the region.

Pure Winds exists to create conversations between performers and audiences through high quality chamber concerts and engaging educational programs. The quartet performs at the Robin Theatre and in k-12 schools. They request a **\$5,000** donation to help cover the cost of operations for 2024.



Rocking Chair Deserters Inc. provides education, enrichment, health awareness and social programs for seniors living in the tri-county area. Membership numbers at the center have declined since COVID, resulting in budget cuts for entertainment. A donation of \$2,000 would allow the center to hire musicians, magicians, and other entertainers for the senior center.



Help Capture the Story of REACH www.talkingdogfilm.com

Talking Dog Film, a nonprofit video production company, believes everyone's story matters and deserves to be told in a beautiful and compelling way. They have been approached by REACH Studio Art Center to capture their legacy story after serving Lansing for 20 years. A donation of **\$2,500** will cover costs such as travel for interviews and postproduction editing of the video created.



Upping Lansing's Poetry Game www.the517poetryroom.com

The Poetry Room provides a space for people of color, and others to tell their stories. This is done through a monthly series of open mic events that include 20+ poets and 2-3 musicians. A donation of \$5,000 will cover the cost for ten monthly events, including performer travel and lodging, sound, and other venue-related expenses.



The Tri-County **Veterans Archives** project aims to capture and preserve untold Military Veterans' stories in Ingham, Eaton, and Clinton counties. A gift of **\$5,000** will support 20 audio recorded narratives from people of color and other underrepresented Veteran groups. Recordings are provided to the veteran on a memory card and archived for future access.

BASIC NEED ITEMS (NON-FOOD ITEMS)



Diaper Bank www.cardboardprophets.org

Cardboard Prophets is a street-based outreach in Lansing with a distribution site in the Lansing Mall. Their focus is on people who are homeless or at risk of homelessness. They request \$5,000 to purchase diapers, wipes, and other baby supplies, as well as laundry supplies such as detergent, bleach, and dryer sheets for qualifying individuals throughout lngham County.

Caring Neighbor Foundation creates a culture of caring, by organizing and funding Thanksgiving baskets, Christmas gifts for children and fundraisers for the local food pantry. They request **\$5,000** to purchase Christmas gifts for children in need and household items needed for the family. These specifically include items that cannot be purchased with a Bridge card such as cleaning supplies and personal hygiene items.

Covered by Love focuses on serving at-risk youth, seniors and the unhoused with the basic needs that are often forgotten. Undergarments are amongst the least donated items to charity. Covered by Love packs 100s of bags with underwear, socks, thermals, t-shirts, handwarmers, hats, gloves, snacks, and information on community resources. A gift of \$5,000 would support 200 bags filled with these basic need items.

Elsie Area Food Pantry serves 300 families and nearly 900 individuals. Most clients receive support with SNAP benefits which helps them with food items. A large void for many of these families is struggling to provide personal items for themselves. A gift of **\$5,000** would allow us to provide items such as detergent, soaps, toiletries, and other personal care needs.



Footprints of Michigan is committed to making a tangible difference in the lives of children in our community. Through our Back-to-School Event, we aim to provide essential footwear to students from kindergarten to 6th grade, empowering them to start the school year with confidence and dignity. A gift of **\$5,000** will purchase approximately 150 pairs of footwear for the event.

Good Sheperds Love offers free assistance to those in need. A gift of **\$5,000** will purchase 6 pallets of home goods for families, as well as restock pantry shelves with personal care, kitchen, and bathroom necessities. Extra funds will help provide 21 days of room credits for the homeless community in Eaton Rapids.

Helping Hands of Eaton County is a food pantry serving Mid-Michigan families. They provide a seven-day supply of food and personal hygiene products every 30 days to those in need. They request **\$5,000** to purchase a three-month supply of items such as toilet paper, laundry soap, shampoo, and toothbrushes, none of which are covered by assistance programs.

Those belongings are then stored to be reunited with their owners.

A gift of **\$4,980** would bolster our goal of improving access to our community through technology expansion, subsidizing fixed costs to keep membership fees low, and providing additional STEAM opportunities.

Garden of Hope Scholarship mentors youth with a strong focus on STEAM education, community engagement, and addressing pressing challenges like poverty and disaster response.
